WHEREAS the Heritage Analysis and Evaluation Report, attached as Document 5 finds that the former CPR Bridge meets the requirements of Ontario Regulation 09/06 for designation under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act;

WHEREAS the Heritage Analysis and Evaluation Report finds that the bridge is one of the last remnants of historical rail infrastructure leading to the core of the city;

WHEREAS Report ACS2023- PRE-RHU-0015 recommends against designation of the former CPR Bridge under the Ontario Heritage Act until other considerations are assessed through a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment;

WHEREAS the City of Ottawa has designated properties under the Ontario Heritage Act where private sector, institutional and public owners have objected citing valid other considerations; WHEREAS the City of Ottawa as owner of the former CPR bridge should not be perceived as exercising a "double standard" by making the designation subject to other considerations.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Recommendation 3 of the report be removed and replaced with the following:

 3. Issue a Notice of Intention to Designate the former Canadian Pacific Railway Bridge under Part IV of the Ontario Heritage Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that staff be directed to prepare a Statement of Cultural Heritage Value based on the Heritage Evaluation and Survey Form attached as Document 5, for consideration by Council.
