SUMMARY

The owners of 106 Prince Albert st plan to develop the property, demolishing the house that is currently there and replacing it with a new building. No protection measures or modifications to plans are necessary.

Boxelder Maple

The boxelder maple in the back yard of 106 Prince Albert St is in poor condition due to significant storm damage and structural defects. Two large branches failed in May of 2022 during the Derecho, leaving large wounds that will likely develop a fungal infection. These






branch failures have also effectively narrowed the girth of the main stem and thereby reduced its structrual stability.

The tree also has a significant northward lean over the parking lot of the adjacent apartment building. Whole-tree failure at the roots is very common for this species, especially when such a severe lean is present.

The tree does not impact construction as it needs to be removed anyway due to its condition. The owners of 106 Prince Albert st intend to remove the tree. As such, protection of the tree with fencing during construction would be pointless.





Other Trees

All other trees on the property are under 30cm DBH and do not require protection or modifications to plans.
