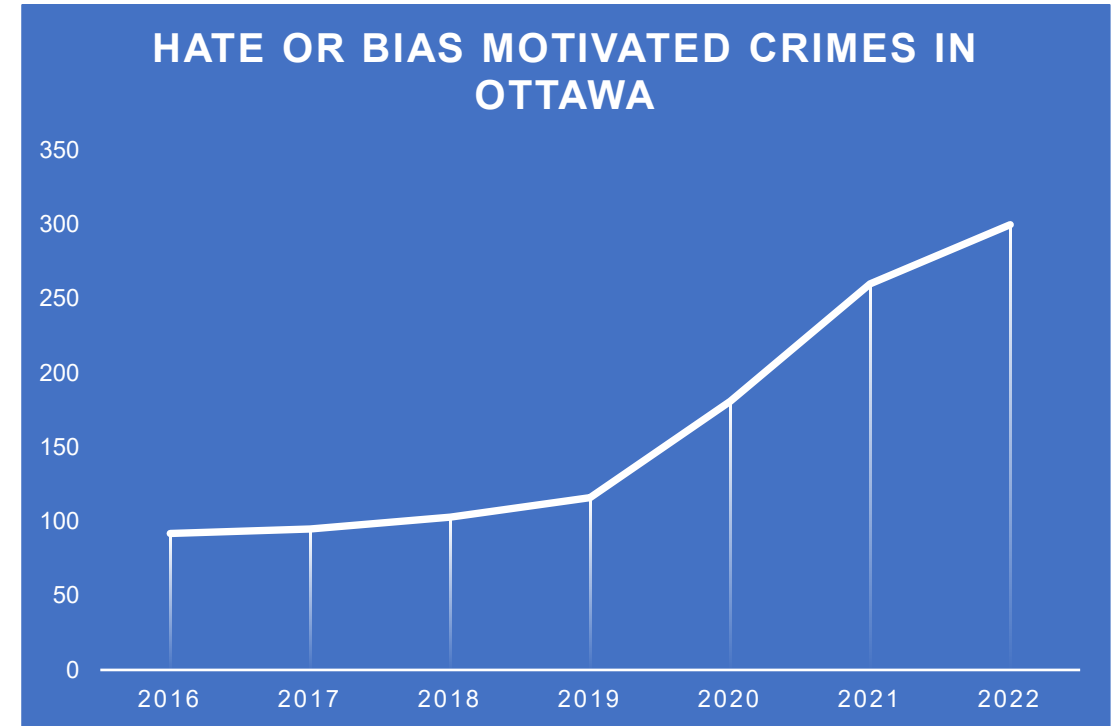

What is a hate crime?

- A criminal offence committed against a person or property that is based solely upon the victim's race, religion, nationality, ethnic origin, sexual orientation, gender or disability

Measuring Hate Crime

- The Uniform Crime Reporting Survey (UCR) is used to collect and report crime data in Canada.
- Ensures that data is collected consistently across the country.
- Statistics Canada updated the data standard in 2022 following nationwide consultation.



Non-Criminal Hate Incidents

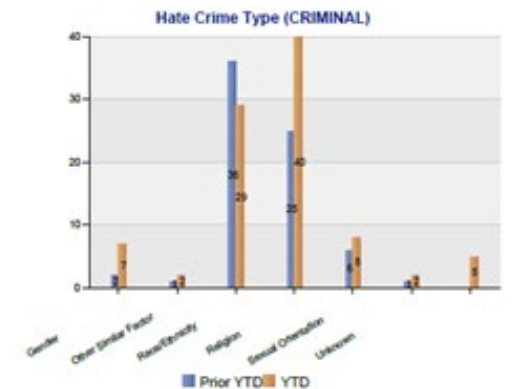
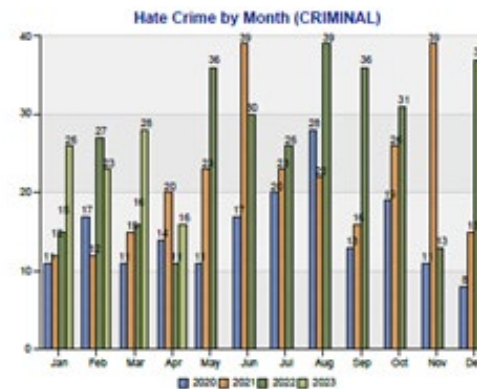
- Not all incidents of hate or prejudice meet the criminal threshold.
- This is a data gap at the national level.
- The Ottawa Police Service investigates and reports on ALL non-criminal incidents the same as criminal files.
- Each report is followed up with the complainant and a subsequent conversation with the accused.

Progress

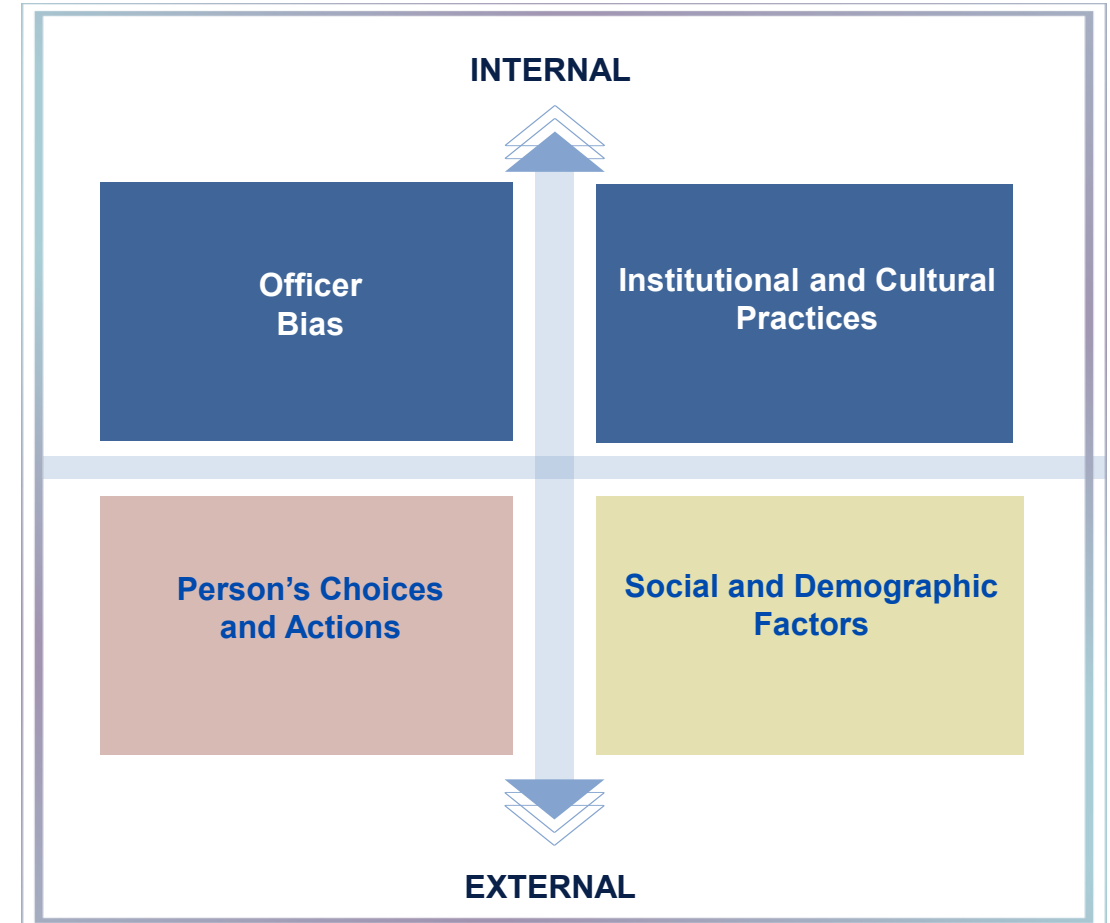
- Foundational work underway

Race & Identity-Based Data Strategy

- Developing a multi-year race and social identity data strategy
- Builds on recommendations from past work/ Community Equity Council
- **Our Goal:**
 - Identify drivers of disparity
 - Co-create solutions with the community and membership (including reporting)
 - Improve community safety
 - Build transparency and increase trust

Drivers of Disparity



Consultation and Collaboration

- **Engaging stakeholders**

Understand views on race and identity-based data collection and its impact on policing.

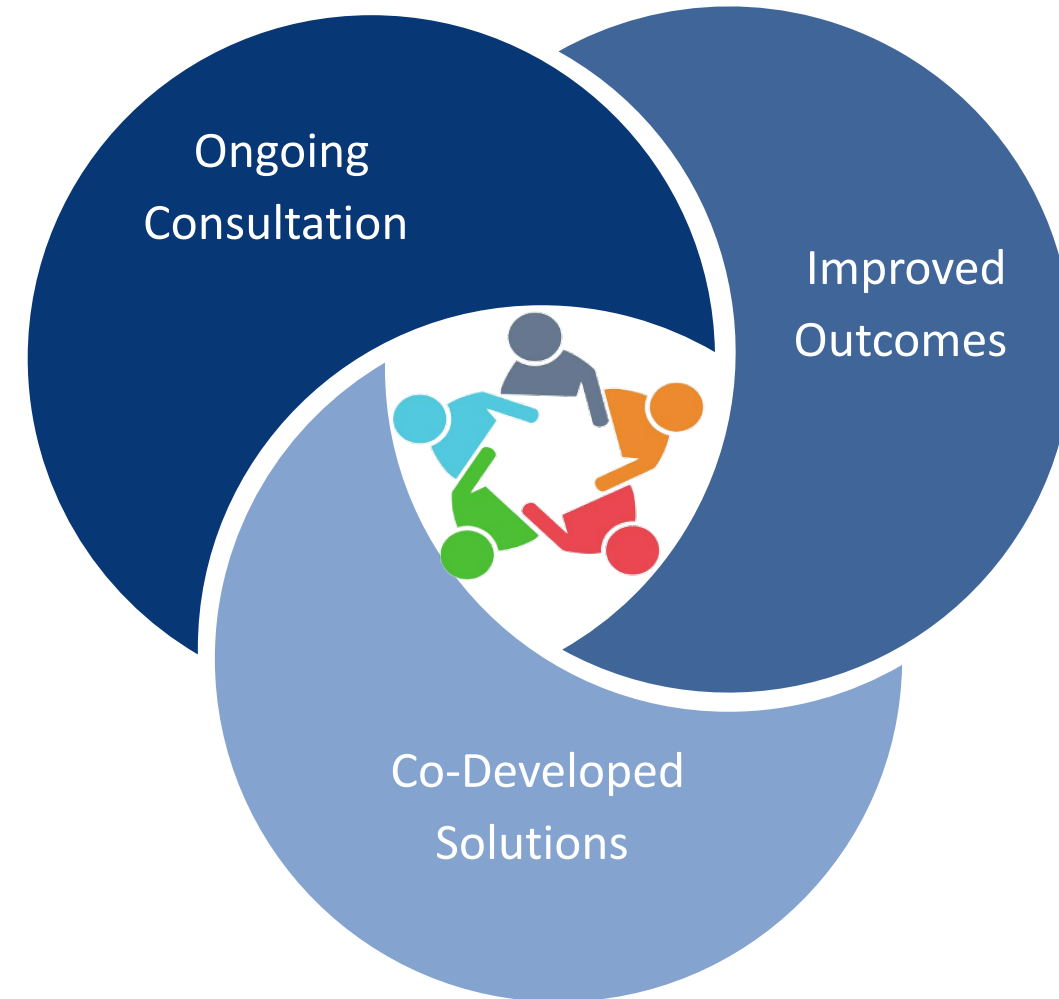
- **Establish a collaborative working group**

Form a team that is expertise based, including community

- **Regular consultation and feedback loops**

Maintain communication to discuss progress, seek feedback, and demonstrate accountability.

Reporting back to Board in September



Analysis and Reporting

- Building internal expertise:
 - Race and identity-based data collection
 - Data analytics (Data engineering, spatial analysis, data science)
 - Equity and diversity
- Analysis and reporting framework to be developed in collaboration with the Community Equity Council and academic experts
 - This will enable a collective analysis approach, with more prompt and transparent public reporting of findings
- Approach aligns with the OACP's Race Identity-Based Data Strategy
