Excerpt from Letter: I've had many interactions with the Ottawa police. I'll be honest, 90 percent of the time they are talking me down because I'm about to hurt myself or they are trying to find my exact location and calling me to make sure I'm safe and not hurt. I deal with a wide variety of mental illnesses and emotional breakdowns aren't uncommon. Sometimes those emotions get out of control, and I find myself in crisis, unable to make decisions to keep myself safe and alive. In January I went into crisis. I had a knife, and I was literally minutes away from stabbing myself and slicing open my aorta. Someone in my life at the time became worried because of the text messages I left and called the police to do a wellness check on me. When the police arrived, I had the blade pointing toward my diaphragm. The four responding officers were not demanding or aggressive at all and took their time to talk with me man to man until I relinquished the weapon. They took me to the hospital, and I witnessed a total of eight police officers genuinely concerned about my well-being; each and every one of them saying kind compassionate words and statements, especially the two officers that were left overnight to supervise me. Every one of the officers treated me with such dignity respect and genuine care that it literally blew my mind when I reflected later the next day. I particularly remember a female officer who played a huge part in calming my PTSD. I kept disassociating back to a traumatic experience over and over and every time she noticed I was going in and out of reality she would ask me kindly what was I remembering and what about it was emotionally hard to deal with etc. The young male police officer -- and this part usually makes me tear up because of the genuine kindness and generosity shown to me -- hadn't eaten lunch yet and got a big bag of shawarma for himself and the female officer. Without me saying anything he asked me when the last time I ate. My nerves will reduce my appetite so I often forget to eat, and it had been 24 hours prior to the distress call since I last ate anything. He offered to get me something to eat. I could not believe it. This officer went out of his way and spent his hard-earned money to give me food. The Ottawa police will always have a place in my heart and mind, and I wanted to share my admiration and absolute respect for what they do. I really want everyone in uniform to know that they DO make a difference and for me, I genuinely felt loved and respected.

They spent time with both the boy's parents, explaining to them how they would address the call now that they were on site, and then spent time with the boy. They were understanding and helped to de-escalate the situation. Please pass on our sincere compliments to them. We were very impressed.

I am very, very grateful to the OPS and so surprised with the help and courtesy I observed during my first encounter with your Service.
