
# who we ARE



#### neighbour hood ambassador program

In collaboration with Ottawa Public Health (OPH), the Integrated Neighbourhood Service Team (INST) and BGC Ottawa, the Neighborhood Ambassador Program (NAP) provides outreach services in 19 Ottawa Neighbourhoods.

In 2022 the NAP team continued to listen to the opinions of youth, support youth development activities, provide youth with development opportunities, and provide professional development of the ambassadors.

- 18011 interactions
- 15 referrals made
- 18 infrastructure deficiencies reported to the city

#### Provincial youth out reach workers

We are here to reach out and help youth between the ages of 12-24 find and connect with helpful programs and services like BGC Ottawa.

Our Provincial Youth Outreach Workers meet youth through outreach in various settings and locations, including Ottawa neighbourhoods, community centres, parks, schools, on the street, online through social media and by referrals from parents and service providers.

- 744 youth participants
- 76 family participants
- 926 interactions
- 536 referrals made
- 281 employment referrals
- 49 education referrals
- 101 recreation referrals
- 313 activities (outreach, groups, committee meetings, & events)

#### Diversion

The Ottawa Community Youth Diversion Program (OCYDP) seeks to improve the manner in which our community supports youth who are in conflict with the law.

The OCYDP aims to hold the young person accountable for his/her/their actions by providing timely and meaningful consequences. Through the OCYDP, the young person is provided an opportunity to avoid further involvement in the justice system, and they do not have to face the negative consequences of having a youth criminal record.




Created a brave and safer space for African descent staff during BHM to share experiences and provide peer support.
