APPLICANT'S PROPOSAL AND PURPOSE OF THE APPLICATIONS:

The Owners want to establish an easement for vehicle access and parking over a portion of their property, in favour of the abutting property owner at 1754 Scott Street.

At its Hearing on July 4, 2023, the Committee adjourned this application to allow the Owners time to apply for required minor variances from the Zoning By-law.

CONSENT IS REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

The Owners require the Consent of the Committee for a Grant of Easement/Right-of-Way.

The subject property is shown as Parts 1, 2, 3, 10 and 11 on a Draft 4R Plan filed with the application.

It is proposed to create an easement/right-of-way for vehicle access and parking over Parts 10 and 11, in favour of the owners of 1754 Scott Street.

REQUESTED VARIANCE:

The Owners require the Committee's authorization for minor variances from the Zoning By-law as follows:

- a) To permit parking to be located on a different lot as the use or building for which it is provided, whereas the By-law requires that parking be located on the same lot as the use or building for which it is provided.
- b) To permit a reduced width for a parking space of 2.47 metres, whereas the Bylaw requires a minimum width for a parking space of 2.6 metres.
- c) To permit a reduced width for a driveway of 2.47 metres wide, whereas the Bylaw requires a minimum driveway width of 2.6 metres.

IF YOU DO NOT PARTICIPATE in the hearing, it may proceed in your absence, and you will not receive any further notice of the proceedings.

IF YOU WANT TO BE NOTIFIED OF THE DECISION following the hearing, and of any subsequent appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal, submit a written request to the Committee.
