BACKGROUND

At its meeting of December 7, 2022, Ottawa City Council considered a report titled 2022-2026 Council Governance Review (ACS2022-OCC-GEN-0030). In approving this report, Council approved the revised Terms of Reference for Standing Committees, Sub-Committees and the Transit Commission be submitted in draft form to the respective Committees/Commission at their first meeting in 2023 for consideration and recommendation to Council for approval. Accordingly, this report is presented to the Emergency Preparedness and Protective Services Committee for its consideration and approval.

DISCUSSION

As part of the 2022-2026 Council Governance Review report, Council approved the Committee structure for the 2022-2026 Term of Council.

As part of this report, Council established a new Emergency Preparedness and Protective Services Committee responsible for the emergency and protective services mandate of the former Community and Protective Services Committee (CPSC) that operated during the 2018-2022 Term of Council. Specifically, this new Committee would undertake specific responsibilities that were previously set out in the CPSC's Terms of Reference with respect to By-law and Regulatory Services, Ottawa Fire Services, Ottawa Paramedic Services, and Public Safety Service, as well as the Public Policy Development Branch.

Full details on these changes are outlined in the <u>2022-2026 Council Governance</u> <u>Review Report</u>, Part 1.

The draft Terms of Reference for the Emergency Preparedness and Protective Services Committee are attached at Document 1.

The Terms of Reference also include minor updates recommended by staff to reflect current City organizational structure, to provide additional clarity and precision or remove redundancy within the scope of the mandate approved by Council through Governance Review.
