BACKGROUND

This report is being brought forward to approve the members of Council that will sit on the Development Charges (DC) By-law and Community Benefits Charge (CBC) By-law Review Councillors Sponsor Group (Sponsor Group). The Councillor Sponsor group will provide input into the review process. The current Development Charges by-law expires in May of 2024 pursuant to the requirements outlined within the *Development Charges Act*, 1997 (DCA), and the City must pass a new development charge by-law before this date.

The review will also consider the CBC eligible projects and updating the existing CBC by-law. A CBC is a new growth-funding tool (GFT) under the *Planning Act* that allows municipalities to levy a charge against certain forms of higher density development to fund associated development-related capital infrastructure needs. The CBC by-law, pursuant to the *Planning Act*, impose charges against land to pay for the capital costs of facilities, services and matters required because of development and redevelopment. The CBC by-law is subject to review every 5 years, or sooner as prescribed by legislation.

Through the 2022-2026 Council Governance Review report, the City Clerk will bring forward a report and recommendations regarding matters relating to advisory bodies

such as Council Sponsors Groups. Following the City Clerk's report, best practices identified will be incorporated when creating the DC and CBC Sponsor Group.

DISCUSSION

The DC Background Study update is conducted every five years pursuant to the requirements outlined within the DCA. The review will be comprehensive since it will be based on revised masterplans and will also incorporate the recent amendments to the DCA approved under Bill 23 (the More Homes Built Faster Act). The City will also explore options regarding components to the Community Benefits Charge and how it can be incorporated with the 2024 DC by-law. This review will consider how the City maintains the CBC development related capital program, initiated by revisiting the 2022 consultant's Strategy report. The review will consider the CBC by-law itself and a policy that directs staff on how to administer the collection and spending of the charge.

Key objectives will involve reviewing various inputs such as projects specified in the CBC project list, infrastructure costing, contingencies, scope changes and eligible land acquisition costs. The study will incorporate initiatives contained in the new Official Plan, with development-related infrastructure projects listed in the revised Transportation and Infrastructure Master Plans, upon Council approval. The adoption of the various master plans will provide the long-term basis for identifying affordable funding priorities and updated project timing that we be required to finance growth in Ottawa from 2024 - 2046. The revisions will address critical development-related revenue pressures over this planning horizon associated with servicing additional lands included within the urban boundary. The structure of the development charge by-law will continue to be used to contribute to the implementation of policies such as the encouragement of compact development, use of existing infrastructure, and encouragement of mixed-use development.

The Councillors Sponsor Group model is an effective way to provide ongoing advice to City staff in the development of the Development Charges and Community Benefits Charge By-Law updates. Staff are recommending the use of a similar body that would meet at appropriate times to review progress in the development of the updated bylaws, weigh various policy options, make recommendation and act as a sound board.

Staff is recommending that, as this is a city-wide by-law update, the Councillors Sponsors Group be made up of five Members of Council: two representatives of the suburban area, two representatives of the urban area, and one member of the rural area as well as the General Manager Planning, Real Estate and Economic Development, or a designate, as well as other City staff as needed.

This comprehensive update will once again undertake an integrated approach to planning, servicing, and financing growth-related infrastructure and facilities within the confines of the statutory limitations. The Sponsor Group, along with City staff, will ultimately recommend the schedule of charges by type of land use and any associated policy implications to Committee and Council. The critical point in the review is the timing of the adoption of the new by-laws that will take place in 2024.

The establishment of the Councillors Sponsor Group will take place through an Expression of Interest between the approval of this report at Planning and Housing Committee and the City Council meeting on March 22, 2023.

A high-level timeline for the development of the 2024 Development Charges By-law and Community Benefits Charge By-law is set out below:
