Hi Joel,

Thanks for reaching out. If there is no construction proposed here, and no trees in the ROW affected by possible changes to servicing, then no TIR is required with your application.

I will note that for severances of existing houses where no trees exist in the front, we do generally include a condition to have one new tree planted per lot to enhance the streetscape and to work toward the City's Official Plan target of 40% canopy cover. This can be done through the City's Trees In Trust program, which plants trees at no cost to residents. To clear the condition you would simply need to submit 2 application forms within 2 years of the COA decision date. https://ottawa.ca/en/living-ottawa/environment-conservation-and-climate/public-spaces-and-environmental-programs/tree-planting/trees-trust.
