8.4 <u>Neighbourhood Operations Centre Implementation Plan</u>

Chief's report

It was clarified that the Neighbourhood Operations Centre (NOC) is not a police station but rather part of a strategy to improve safety in the ByWard Market. 18 agencies have agreed to partner with the OPS. Currently, there is a challenge with a lack of coordination as well as duplication among service providers and the NOC is intended to be one step in untangling some of these issues.

A suggestion was made for the Service to work on more succinct communications to clarify the role of the NOC for the benefit of the public, including discussing what is and isn't working.

In response to a question, it was noted the 'core' does not have specific boundaries; there is some flexibility.

The Board requested to be kept informed, including on the key performance indicators. A request was made for an initial report back at the April 2024 meeting.
