Excerpt from Letter: I have recently had the pleasure of interacting with Detective Chris Evraire and I wanted to share my experience with you. I am very active on social media and share thoughts on a myriad of issues. During this time, I amassed a decent sized following on Twitter (X). However, with that following comes a lot of negative activity as well. In October of this year, I was made aware of disturbing and threatening comments on my social media. I immediately reported these comments, as I feared for my family's safety. The first time I spoke with Detective Evraire, he was empathetic, kind, and above all, did not "victim blame". He took my report seriously and spoke with me at length about moving the investigation forward. Since that initial conversation, Detective Evraire has checked in on me several times and keeps me up to date on the investigation. It is no secret that I have been publicly critical of the Ottawa Police Service in recent years. I feel very strongly about the responsibility that police officers have within our society, and the need to ensure that they are above reproach. It is fair to say that, as a result of events over the past few years, I had lost faith and trust in the Ottawa Police Service. Detective Evraire changed that. His engagement with me and his dedicated and tireless investigation of threats against my family have given me confidence that there are amazing officers working within the Ottawa Police Service. Detective Evraire has single-handedly helped to begin restoring my confidence in the Ottawa Police Service.

Navigating the complexities of administering lifesaving first aid and defibrillation is never a simple task for our team. Being present on-site within moments of a serious event is a challenge in itself. In the aftermath, during the debriefing with our staff when I did arrive, the consensus echoed a sentiment

of immense relief. The team highlighted not only her unwavering support but also the kindness and compassion she extended to the manager and the entire team. She clearly knew they were going through a stressful traumatic time. My team mentioned that she made it less stressful. I want Sergeant Melissa Plunkett to know that both I and the entire team deeply appreciate her and the Ottawa Police family for your tireless efforts in safeguarding and supporting our community. Personally, I had the privilege of meeting Sergeant Melissa Plunkett today. Her warm welcome, engaging responses to my inquiries, and the genuine compassion she demonstrated for our loss left a lasting impression. Sergeant Melissa Plunkett, your dedication to serving and protecting our community, coupled with your steadfast presence in our times of need, does not go unnoticed.
