The subject site is located within the Centretown Heritage Conservation District and requires a heritage permit for the proposed addition. Staff request an adjournment until a heritage permit is received.

#### **ADDITIONAL COMMENTS**

# Infrastructure Engineering

- 1. Planning, Real Estate and Economic Development Department will do a complete review of grading and servicing during the building permit process.
- 2. Any proposed works to be located within the road allowance requires prior written approval from the Infrastructure Services Department.
- 3. The surface storm water runoff including the roof water must be self contained and directed to the City Right-of-Way, not onto abutting private properties as approved by Planning, Real Estate and Economic Development Department.
- 4. Existing grading and drainage patterns must not be altered.

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### **Planning Forestry**

The proposed addition would require the removal of Tree 7, which appears to be retainable with reasonable design modifications and preservation methods.

As per the approved TIR, the proposed removal of three (3) distinctive trees will require replanting at a 1:1 ratio. A permit will be required for the trees to be removed.
