APPLICANTS PROPOSAL / PURPOSE OF THE APPLICATION:

The Owners want to convey a portion of their property to the abutting property owner to the west, known municipally as 6574 Michelangelo Court.

CONSENT IS REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

The Owner/Applicant requires the consent of the Committee for a lot line adjustment and a grant of easement/right of way. The severed land, shown as Parts 1 to 4 on a Draft 4R-Plan filed with the application, is landlocked and will contain an area of 0.183 hectares. This land contains two

existing accessory buildings and will merge with the property to the west, known municipally as 6574 Michelangelo Court.

The retained land, shown on said sketch, will have a frontage of 6.1 metres on Michelangelo Court, to an irregular depth and will contain a lot area of approximately 8 hectares. This parcel is vacant and is known as 6574 B Michelangelo Court.

It is also proposed to establish an easement/right of way over Parts 2 & 3 on the severed land, in favour of the retained land, for access.

The application also indicates that the property is not the subject of any other current application under the *Planning Act*.

IF YOU DO NOT PARTICIPATE in the hearing, it may proceed in your absence, and you will not receive any further notice of the proceedings.

IF YOU WANT TO BE NOTIFIED OF THE DECISION following the hearing, and of any subsequent appeal to the Ontario Land Tribunal, submit a written request to the Committee.

Information you choose to disclose in your correspondence, including your personal information, will become part of the public record, and shared with Committee Members, the Applicant(s) or their agent, and any other interested individual.

You will receive details on how to participate by videoconference. If you want to share a visual presentation, the Coordinator can provide details on how to do so. Presentations are limited to five minutes, and any exceptions are at the discretion of the Chair.

Hearings are governed by the Committee of Adjustment's *Rules of Practice and Procedure* accessible online.

COMMITTEE OF ADJUSTMENT

The Committee of Adjustment is the City of Ottawa's quasi-judicial tribunal created under the Ontario *Planning Act*. Each year, it holds hearings on hundreds of applications under the *Planning*

Act in accordance with the Ontario *Statutory Powers Procedure Act*, including consents to sever land and minor variances from the zoning requirements.
