Excerpt from Letter: We have an adult son with a serious mental health condition and there was problem with his medications, and he was experiencing delusions and psychosis. He had disappeared on Friday night, which was very unusual for him, so I went to Elgin Street headquarters to file a missing persons report at 3 p.m. on Saturday. I was panicking and person at the reception was very helpful, and we set it up for an Officer to come to my home. Once I reached home Constables Labao and Trebinskie arrived shortly after I got home (around 4 p.m.). Constable Labao waited with me at home, took photos of my son and got his phone number, communicated with Constable Kabuya and calmed me down while he was on the phone with Constable Kabuya who was searching the area (where his cell phone was pinging) with Constable Cohen. They were getting closer and closer to finding our son and then Constable Kabuya reached our son and was very warm and disarming to him, just being cool and casual, asking him how he was (our son related this to me later and still has great memories of meeting and talking with Constable Kabuya). Overall, WITHIN TWO HOURS from when I first went down to the Police station, (and on that busy Saturday), the team had not only found our son, they were so welcoming to him that he agreed to go to hospital where he was subsequently admitted. I was super impressed and very grateful for the quick and competent work, especially Constable Kabuya who demonstrated his knowledge and competency for dealing with neurodiverse persons. He de-escalated the situation and showed empathy and understanding for our son who has a serious mental health diagnosis. Kudos to this team, I could not let this great work go unnoticed. Please continue diversifying your force and giving them training regarding providing sensitive services to our diverse community (i.e. disability, racial/ethnic background and sexual orientation.. Thank you from all our family!

Excerpt from Letter: I wanted to share the exceptional experience I had with Officer Idris Mcloba as well as Christine Laroche on June 1st 2024: The officers brought in a youth to CHEO on a sec. 17 who spoke very little English; Swahili being her first language.

The officers had been called to the group home where the youth was residing due to her perceived aggression in the home. I was told when the officers responded the youth did attempt to strike them with her fists. It was evident Idris was able to connect with the youth as by the time she presented in the ED her mood was much calmer and more relaxed than the reasoning for her to be brought in. Idris remained in the hospital room with the youth the entire time, ensuring she had someone to talk to and to help occupy her time.

When it came time for the assessment, and to deliver some bad news, I mentioned to Idris the hospital has access to zoom based interpreters so that he does not need to feel pressured into being the one responsible for translating and delivering the bad/upsetting news. After less than a minute of contemplation he agreed to participate. He not only faithfully translated the meeting, but he also empathized with the youth and provided her with the reassurance he could.

Thank you to both Idris and Christine for the support they provided to this youth.
