

Vanier Culture in ACTION Plan

[Community led Cultural Revitalization in a priority neighborhood]

May 2024

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Overview

The Vanier Culture in ACTION Plan follows five years of deep and ongoing collaboration between the City of Ottawa and residents of Vanier on how best to culturally revitalize the neighbourhood. It recognizes that while the neighbourhood faces significant challenges, it has many strengths to build upon – a rich and storied history, unique diversity, and incredible promise.

The 39 action items contained in the Vanier Culture in ACTION Plan serve as a map for the next stage of the cultural revitalization of Vanier. These action items started as 193 ideas shared and discussed by residents in community forums, focus groups and targeted engagement sessions designed to ensure that the feedback received was as representative of the community as possible. The ideas were then refined into action items and prioritized by the community-led Vanier Cultures Steering Committee and Subcommittees with the support of City staff. The involvement and leadership of the community throughout this process has been essential in creating wide community buy-in.

Shared responsibility is a key feature of this plan. In total, 8 community organizations and 17 different City of Ottawa work areas identified as having a role to play in delivering the action plan and achieving the nine revitalization-focused goals first identified in the Vanier Culture in Action Strategy shared with community in 2022.

Objective

This ACTION Plan formalizes ongoing collaboration between the City of Ottawa and Vanier community to support the neighbourhood's cultural development and revitalization. Crucially, any revitalization must benefit all who call Vanier home – those from all walks of life who live, work, play and are culturally connected to the neighbourhood.

The Draft Strategy for the Revitalization of the Cultural Life of Vanier Residents developed for consideration by the Vanier Cultures Steering Committee and the City of Ottawa Internal Vanier Culture in Action Working Group in 2022 sets out nine clear goals for the cultural development in Vanier which guide this work.

Goals

1. Oversee initiatives that help organize Vanier's cultural life
2. Enhance cultural life on traditional main streets
3. Enhance cultural life in public spaces and plazas
4. Celebrate diversity and welcome newcomers through cultural programming and initiatives

5. Revitalize Vanier's image as a thriving cultural hub
6. Acknowledge and collaborate with Indigenous residents and Indigenous cultural organizations in Vanier
7. Include cultural aspects and requirements into a Vanier Secondary Plan that is consistent with the Montreal Road Secondary Plan
8. Revitalize Richelieu-Vanier Community Centre by offering and encouraging more cultural and artistic programming
9. Promote Muséoparc Vanier as a tourist destination

Impact

The Draft Strategy for the Revitalization of the Cultural Life of Vanier Residents identifies several potential impacts of this kind of cultural revitalization work, grounded in extensive research on what has worked in neighbourhoods facing challenges on a similar scale to those found in Vanier including SoHo (New York, US), Saint-Roch (Quebec, Canada), M-50 Arts District (Shanghai, China) and Arts District (Los Angeles, US).

That community-led cultural development has a direct, positive impact on neighbourhood life across cities, countries and cultures provides hope that this can be successful in an Ottawa context.

The impacts of community-led cultural revitalization identified include:

- Strengthened community, social and cultural life
- Improved self-reported resident wellbeing, sense of belonging and overall quality of life
- Increased inter-cultural dialogue and reduction in identity-based discrimination
- Enhanced neighbourhood reputation and sense of local pride
- Economic development through attraction and retention of businesses and residents, job creation and talent development
- Dismantling of organizational silos that serve as barriers to collaboration and collective impact

Project development

Background

Work in collaboration with local communities emerged as a priority during the development of the Council-approved Renewed Action Plan for Arts, Heritage, and Culture in Ottawa (2013-2018). The Renewed Action Plan championed the preservation and development of cultural and creative places and spaces (Strategy II)

This was followed in 2019 through the development of the Council-approved Building Better Revitalized Neighbourhoods project. One objective of this project was to support the life and work of artists in Vanier, revitalize the heritage, cultural and creative sector and establish Vanier as a cultural and creative district. The initiative focused on revitalization through new and existing program and service initiatives, infrastructure projects as well as redevelopment.

Following substantial mapping, research and analysis by the Cultural Development and Initiatives Unit, Vanier was identified as the neighbourhood in Ottawa with the greatest potential for culture to positively impact residents, socially and economically. Vanier holds complex histories, stories, heritage, socio-demographic mix, urban form, and community clusters and hubs. Additionally, Vanier residents carry a distinct composition of Indigenous, Francophone and newcomer identities, including its artists, creatives, entrepreneurs, and community leaders. Combined, these demographics and indicators placed it at the forefront for neighbourhood potential.

Professionals from the City of Ottawa's Cultural Development and Initiatives Unit have facilitated development of Vanier Culture in Action, in partnership with the Vanier Community Association, community steering committee and municipal inter-departmental working group.

Engagement

To develop Vanier Culture in ACTION, CDI and partners employed a variety of community engagement tools, including focus groups, online sessions, Citizen Forums and Community Steering Committees.

In following a community-led approach, residents and organizations were empowered to explore and identify gaps and opportunities for cultural revitalization. This allowed for the Vanier Culture in ACTION Plan to benefit from the shared knowledge and experiences of those directly involved in cultural work, programming, and social services in the neighborhood. It fosters ownership of the strategy and action plan. It also brings together a group of community cultural champions as diverse as the neighborhood it represents.

Community

Vanier Citizen Forum

The Vanier Community Association invited Vanier residents in May-June of 2021 to play an active role in the design of the community's cultural strategy through a bilingual Citizens' Forum process, a form of Action Research which invites a diverse representation of the community to help define an issue or opportunity and potential solutions. These sessions were attended by over 200 residents and generated 193 suggestions used to develop the strategy and action plan.

Francophone artist focus group

This consultation was organized with the support of the Centre d'artistes Voix Visuelle. It brought together twenty Francophone artists from the Vanier Community to explore the current cultural reality of the neighborhood and identify possible needed support from the City of Ottawa and on a community level.

Vanier Cultures Steering Committee

The Community Steering committee is composed of representatives of Vanier community service providers, cultural workers, the Business Improvement Area, artists, and representatives from the community association. Created in 2022, the objective of this group has been to:

1. Review and adjust a set of actions proposed during consultations, focus groups and through Engage Ottawa.
2. Agree on the set of actions that will form the basis of the Vanier Culture in ACTION Plan
3. Identify which actions will be the sole responsibility of the City, which will be the sole responsibility of community groups in Vanier, and which the City and the community will share responsibility for implementing.
4. Collaborate in the implementation of Vanier Culture in Action to revitalize the cultural life of Vanier residents.

Focus groups

To develop the action plan, the Steering Committee convened focus groups to examine strategy goals and corresponding action items suggested through community consultations. Focus groups examined one or more goals related to the membership's areas of expertise and used the 193 suggested actions from Citizen Forums as a starting point for discussion.

The Steering Committee and CDI staff examined gaps in representation and invited additional voices to join focus groups or to connect in 1:1 conversations to share expertise.

These additional voices included residents, artists, local and city-wide community organizations, youth, and members of equity deserving communities including IBOC, 2SLGBTQQ2A+ and FNIM voices. Over 10 focus group sessions, with 30+ participants were held during summer 2023.

Engage Ottawa

As part of the larger Vision Vanier project, Engage Ottawa was used as a tool for residents to share their thoughts regarding culture in Vanier. Feedback, had any been received, would have been integrated in the development of the Strategy. Residents were encouraged to provide feedback on

- 1. Ideas for revitalizing arts, culture and heritage in Vanier
- 2. Places and activities that are important to community arts, culture and heritage life in Vanier
- 3. How to improve the City of Ottawa’s recreation programs in Vanier

Over a month period, the Engage Ottawa portal received 40 total visits, a full break down of engagement is found below.

City of Ottawa

Interdepartmental working group

The interdepartmental working group included representatives from a range of work areas at the City of Ottawa. These included staff involved with Public Art, Economic Development, Cultural Funding Support, Community Arts and Social Engagement, Policy Planning, Zoning and Intensification, and more.

The working group focused on planning, collaboration, coordination, and information sharing across City departments to improve, champion and deliver the highest standard of cultural planning.

Members of the working group participated in planning discussions for Vanier: Culture in Action and collaborated on identifying short and long-term visions, plans and initiatives pertinent for the Vanier: Culture in Action Culture Strategy and Action Plan.

Vanier: Culture in Action

The Vanier Culture in Action Plan was based on 193 ideas submitted by Vanier residents who participated in multiple focus groups in 2020 and 2021, as well as focus groups held with francophone artists, and input generated through Engage Ottawa. More than 200 residents participated in 2-to-6-hour discussion sessions.

CDI organized submissions from residents into themes reflecting aspirations, challenges and opportunities highlighted through engagements. The Community Steering Committee, with support from CDI and the interdepartmental working group then outlined the strategy into the nine goals each containing issues, theories of change and overall objectives.

The Action Plan identifies 39 action items framed around the 9 goals in the strategy. In many cases, action items support more than 1 goal outlined in the Strategy. To develop the Action Plan, the Steering Committee convened into focus groups to examine strategy goals and corresponding action items suggested through community consultations. Focus groups examined 1 or more goals related to its areas of expertise and used the 193 suggested actions from Citizen Forums as a starting point for discussion.

CDI identified direct actions and themes that address the priorities, challenges and opportunities found in the strategy. This included identifying possible service areas and leads at municipal level and community levels. Through 1:1 connections by City staff and the inter-departmental working group, further actions, service areas and support mechanisms were identified.

Implementation plan

Community and City staff identified close, long-term collaboration between City departments and community as the strongest option for successful implementation of the Action plan and fulfillment of the Strategy’s objectives.

Actions include incentives, initiatives, and programming as key priorities. Many initiatives are to be carried out by or in partnership with cultural organizations, artists and cultural workers from this priority neighborhood.

To oversee City of Ottawa implementation, an RCFS Department-led Working Group for Vanier Culture In Action is proposed with the Terms of Reference provided as Document 2. This working group will allow for community members to work directly alongside city staff to:

- provide guidance and advice for the implementation of the Strategy and Action Plan’s related actions focussed on service areas and policy connected to City of Ottawa departments, branches, and units;
- collaborate, challenge, debate, troubleshoot, resolve issues, and provide clarification as required; and
- identify gaps and assist in making links to community, involved municipal service areas, other levels of government, private sector, and other agencies.

The Community Steering committee will continue to oversee implementation of the Strategy and Action Plan items related to community led initiatives.

Matrix 1 demonstrates the link between the action items and overarching goals of the strategy. Most actions are designed to serve multiple goals simultaneously, an effort to improve the overall effectiveness of the plan.

Matrix 2 provides information about the time horizon and responsibility for each action item. Actions are broken down three time-periods.
