DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

The Planning, Real Estate and Economic Development Department has no concerns with the application.

DISCUSSION AND RATIONALE

Staff have reviewed the subject minor variance application against the "four tests" as outlined in Section 45 (1) of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c. P.13, as amended. Staff are satisfied that the requested minor variance(s) meet(s) the "four tests". The intent of the rooftop terrace provisions is to ensure privacy for neighbouring properties. The applicant has proposed privacy screens along the deck that abuts the interior lot lines. which will mitigate privacy concerns.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Infrastructure Engineering

- The surface storm water runoff including the roof water must be self-contained and directed to the City Right-of-Way, not onto abutting private properties as approved by Planning, Development and Building Services Department.
- Existing grading and drainage patterns must not be altered.
- The Planning, Development and Building Services Department will do a complete review of grading and servicing during the building permit process.

At the time of building permit application, a grading/servicing plan prepared by a Professional Engineer, Ontario Land surveyor or a Certified Engineering Technologist will be required.

Planning Forestry

- The private trees on site must be protected throughout construction, as per the recommendations of the TIR (dated Apr. 12, 2024 & prepared by IFS).
- Where access or construction staging requirements conflict with Tree Protection fencing, horizontal tree protection must be installed to prevent compaction, as per item 5 of the Tree Protection Specification.
