DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

The Planning, Development and Building Services Department has no concerns with the application.

DISCUSSION AND RATIONALE

Staff have reviewed the subject minor variance application against the "four tests" as outlined in Section 45 (1) of the *Planning Act*, R.S.O. 1990 c. P.13, as amended.

The subject site is in the Inner Urban Transect and designated as a hub, as per outlined in Schedules A and B2 of the Official Plan. The zoning for the subject lot is Arterial Mainstreet 10 (AM10). This area is intended to function as a hub, supporting high densities and intensification with an emphasis on public and active transportation.

The intent of the AM10 subzone 50% glazing requirement is to facilitate interest along the street through building materials and encourage foot-traffic for commercial uses located on the ground floor. Staff do not have any concerns with reducing the glazing percentage to 27%. This is an existing building that has hosted several commercial uses since its construction in 1968. Now, in the absence of commercial uses at-grade, the intent of the provision has less applicability to the development. Overall, the variance is appropriate as it will enable the residents of the ground-floor units to have more privacy and support residential uses in proximity to the other commercial uses along Carling Avenue.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Planning Forestry

There are no tree-related impacts associated with the requested variance.

The applicant should consider planting trees at the front of the property to enhance the streetscape and contribute towards the City's 40% canopy goal.
