#### APPLICANT'S PROPOSAL AND PURPOSE OF THE APPLICATION:

The Owner wants to convert the existing six-unit stacked dwelling into a low-rise apartment building by constructing a three-story addition at the rear of the dwelling. The new addition will contain four dwelling units, for a total of 10-units, as shown on plans filed with the Committee.

At its hearing on August 2, 2023, the Committee adjourned this application *sine die* to allow the Applicant time to consult with area residents. The Applicant has submitted revised material and wishes to proceed with the application.

#### REQUESTED VARIANCE:

The Applicant requires the Committee's authorization for a minor variance from the Zoning By-law to permit a reduced rear yard setback of 2.94 metres, whereas the By-law requires a minimum rear yard setback of 4 metres,

The application indicates that the front lot line is on Devonshire Lane.

**THE APPLICATION** also indicates that the Property is not the subject of any other current application under the *Planning Act*.

**IF YOU DO NOT PARTICIPATE** in the hearing, it may proceed in your absence, and you will not receive any further notice of the proceedings.
