## REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Receive and table the 2025 Draft Operating Budget for the Ottawa Board of

Health; and

2. Direct staff to forward the 2025 Draft Operating Budget for the Ottawa Board of Health to Ottawa City Council on November 13, 2024 as part of City Council's tabling of the City of Ottawa 2025 Draft Operating and Capital budget; and

That, at its meeting of December 2, 2024, the Board of Health for the City of Ottawa Health Unit:

- 3. Approve the 2025 Draft Operating Budget for the Ottawa Board of Health;
- 4. Upon the Board of Health's approval of the 2025 Draft Operating Budget for the Ottawa Board of Health, direct staff to forward the report to Ottawa City Council, for consideration on December 11, 2024, as part of City Council's approval of the City of Ottawa 2025 Draft Operating and Capital budget; and
- 5. Upon approval of the 2025 Draft Operating Budget for the Ottawa Board of Health by the Board of Health and Ottawa City Council, direct the Medical Officer of Health (or delegate), on behalf of the Board of Health, to forward the 2025 Annual Service Plan and Budget Submission to the Ontario Ministry of Health (MOH) for consideration based on the approved 2025 Operating Budget for the Ottawa Board of Health.

#### BACKGROUND

## **OPH's Budget Priorities for 2025**

Ottawa Public Health's 2025 operating budget priority is to advance the health of Ottawa's population through optimum and efficient use of existing resources.

The operating budget supports programs and services that:

- Address the top population health needs (e.g., healthy growth and development; case management of reportable infectious diseases; environmental health, infection prevention and control; chronic disease prevention and wellbeing including immunization, oral health, sexual health, mental health, and substance use health; health surveillance and emergency response);
- Contribute to accomplishing OPH's 2023-2027 strategic goals and objectives;
- Contribute to achieving the term-of-council priorities set by Ottawa City Council;
   and
- Comply with Ontario Public Health Standards.

The resource allocation underscores OPH's dedication to advancing health equity, diversity, inclusion, and Indigenous Rights and well-being with Urban Indigenous populations, including First Nations, Inuit, and Métis communities.

### 2025 Budget Pressures and Broader Context

Ottawa Public Health (OPH) is experiencing a compensation pressure of \$2.56 million, driven by provisions for potential cost of living adjustments, salary increases, and

benefits needed to maintain current staffing levels. The OPH leadership team has also conducted a thorough assessment of budget pressures, not just to sustain core public health services, but also to explore growth opportunities to address emerging community needs. A detailed analysis of both immediate and medium-term budget pressures can be found in the report titled <a href="2025 Budget Planning and Considerations for Ottawa Public Health">2025 Budget Planning and Considerations for Ottawa Public Health</a>, presented to the Board of Health in September 2024.

Ottawa Public Health (OPH) is submitting its 2025 operating budget ahead of the Ministry of Health's anticipated introduction of revised Ontario Public Health Standards. Additionally, the Ministry is conducting a funding formula review, in which OPH actively participated, providing key feedback. In its written submission to the Ministry of Health, OPH stressed the need to address its chronic underfunding, which has resulted from the inequitable application of a fair funding model across public health units. OPH also called for annual increases that reflect population growth and inflationary pressures. The results of the funding formula review are anticipated in Spring 2025, with implementation targeted for 2026.

## **Budget Directions**

OPH's 2025 budget is prepared in accordance with the provincial guidance on 2025 revenue growth and City of Ottawa's 2025 Budget Directions:

- A \$395,000 revenue increase, reflecting a 1% rise in the Ministry of Health's 2024 base funding contribution to the cost-shared mandatory programs.
- A \$226,000 revenue increase due to the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services enhanced annual base funding for the Healthy Babies Healthy Children program, effective April 2024.
- A \$1,250,000 increase in net requirement funded by the City of Ottawa, aligned with City Council's directive to base Ottawa Public Health's draft operating budget on a 2.9% increase in the municipal tax levy for public health funding, along with 1.5% assessment growth revenues from new properties.

#### DISCUSSION

## **Operating Budget Summary**

OPH's 2025 net operating budget is \$82.7 million, with 511.11 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions. OPH's staffing level has only grown by 6.2 FTEs over the last 14 years.

The 2025 operating budget submission is \$1.6 million lower than the 2024 budget due to the removal of one-time funding for vaccine program enhancements, PHI Recruitment and Retention, HIV/AIDS, neighbourhood hubs and needle exchange programs, which were previously supported by one-time funding. The reduction of one-time funding in these programs exceeds the increase in the 2025 compensation budget driven by cost-of-living adjustments. Additionally, cost savings are realized through adjustment of cannabis program budget, as well as by reducing facility-related expenses, including compensation contracts, hydro, security, and maintenance costs.

## **Net Requirement**

Net requirement is fully funded by the City of Ottawa.

Total Net Expenditure - Total Estimated Revenue = Net Requirement

\$82,742,000 - \$51,942,000 = \$30,800,000

In 2025, the net requirement is \$1,250,000 higher than the 2024 budget, reflecting a 4.2% increase in City funding compared to the 2024 budget.

#### **RURAL IMPLICATIONS**

### **CONSULTATION**

OPH employee, community partner and stakeholder feedback has been incorporated into priorities for how resources will be used to advance population health in 2025.

Following the tabling of the 2025 Draft Operating Budget for the Ottawa Board of Health at the November 4, 2024 Board of Health meeting, the budget report will be tabled at the City Council meeting of November 13, 2024. The Board will consider the budget for

approval at its subsequent meeting, on December 2, 2024, and submit it to Council on December 11, 2024 as part of the 2025 Budget process.
