BACKGROUND

The City of Ottawa conducts a comprehensive governance review twice during each Council term. The *Mid-Term Governance Review* serves to assess the existing governance structure and make adjustments to improve decision-making efficiency, accountability, and transparency. This review takes into account legislative changes, operational requirements, and stakeholder feedback.

The mid-term governance review directly impacts the Ottawa Police Service Board's composition and appointment processes. As part of this process, City Council has

approved measures to ensure alignment with the statutory requirements of the *Community Safety and Policing Act, 2019*, and to enhance the Board's ability to represent and serve the community effectively.

DISCUSSION

At its January 29, 2025 meeting, City Council approved the following recommendations regarding the Ottawa Police Service Board in accordance with statutory requirements under the *Community Safety and Policing Act*, 2019 (CSPA):

- Board Composition: The Ottawa Police Service Board shall continue to be composed of seven members.
- Diversity Plan: A Diversity Plan was approved, pursuant to section 28 of the CSPA, to ensure that the members of the Ottawa Police Service Board appointed by Council are representative of the diversity of the population in the municipality.

As part of the governance review, City Council has also confirmed the appointment of Board Chair Salim Fakirani and Chief of Police Eric Stubbs as members of the Community Safety and Well-Being Advisory Committee.
