Excerpt from Letter: Hi OPS, we meant to write and thank you earlier, but if our thanks are late, they are nonetheless sincere. On January 28 in late morning, my friend was not answering his phone, and I had not talked him since January 26 (suppertime).

As it turned out, he had suffered an ischemic stroke that affected the left side of his body, and he had fallen and then gotten wedged under his bed.

He would have been there something like 36 hours, wearing nothing in a cold room with open windows.

On that day, all your officers who attended were helpful, thoughtful, and kind. I remember how long it took for one officer to diligently pick the lock (I did not have a key). And another, senior officer stood on the landing a few steps down and kept me talking about my friend and the cottage where we spend time in the summer, and whatnot, while I waited for the door to be opened to admit the waiting paramedics. At that time, I feared that he was either unconscious or dead. But he was not dead. And he was conscious, though his speech was slurred. When he was being placed in the ambulance, that same officer who had kept me talking while we waited asked me if I was okay to drive. I appreciated him asking that. Now here we are, just past the 2-month mark my friends remarkable recovery from the stroke. From the bottom of our hearts, thank you for your quick, kind, and timely efforts on that day.

I'm just one example of the countless lives you've touched and I'm honoured to express my gratitude to each of you. Thank you for your service. Thank you for being there when it matters most. And thank you for helping people like me find a second chance.
