Excerpt from Letter: Saturday evening I filed a report and I was grateful to be assisted by two officers from the Intimate Partner Violence Unit who attended my home on Sunday afternoon. Their conduct was nothing short of exemplary. They were respectful, thorough, trauma-informed, and handled the situation with professionalism and deep empathy. They took the time to ask thoughtful, detailed questions and created space for both myself and my friend to share our reports independently. The care they took in respecting my home — including small gestures like inviting me outside when they needed to speak with my friend privately — made a profound difference in how safe and respected we felt.

Throughout the evening, both Constables followed up by phone with us individually to explain how they would be engaging with the individual and the steps being taken to prevent any further contact. These follow-ups were timely, clear, and incredibly reassuring.

I especially want to express my appreciation to the Officer who helped me understand my right to change the locks to my condo under these circumstances. In the whirlwind of legal complexity, fear, and exhaustion I've been managing, that detail has been difficult for me to fully grasp. He took the time to explain it, to call his supervisor for clarity, and to reassure me — even while being careful to note he was not offering legal advice. That care, patience, and initiative meant a great deal. I would also like to recognize Constable Blake Otterson, who attended my home on April 16 in response to a related incident. I'm relieved to share that as of yesterday afternoon, for the first time in weeks, I feel safe. And it is because of the diligent, compassionate work of these officers that I now have the clarity and capacity to respond to your original message with the gratitude it deserves.

In addition, I want to recognize the extraordinary support we received from Ms. Cassandra Racicot, of the Ottawa Victim Crisis Unit. Her presence and encouragement during this time — from affirming my right to change the locks, to providing ongoing support before and after the peace bond applications — was nothing short of incredible. I had no idea these kinds of resources existed through the Ottawa Police Service, and her care has transformed my understanding of what support for victims can and should look like. OPS has shown not just a commitment to protection, but to healing — and that is something I will never forget.

As a member of the LGBTQ2I+ community — and someone who has experienced significant discrimination throughout my life — I want to highlight that at no point did either myself or my friend feel that our identities had any bearing on how our cases were assessed or handled. The professionalism, neutrality, and dignity we were shown is not something we take for granted. That kind of equitable treatment is still, sadly, not universal — and the respect we received from OPS left a lasting impression. If there is any way I can formally submit this feedback to support commendations or performance recognition within OPS, I would be more than happy to do so. With sincere thanks.
