Infrastructure Engineering

- At the time of building permit application, a grading/servicing plan prepared by a Professional Engineer, Ontario Land surveyor or a Certified Engineering Technologist will be required.
- The surface storm water runoff including the roof water must be self-contained and directed to the City Right-of-Way, not onto abutting private properties, as approved by Planning, Development and Building Services Department.
- Existing grading and drainage patterns must not be altered.
