NOTICE OF BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of  
the City of Ottawa on the 16th day of August, 1978,  
enacted By-law Number 269-78, designating the lands and  
buildings known municipally as 70 Nicholas Street  
as a property of architectural and historical value or interest  
under The Ontario Heritage Act 1974, Statutes of Ontario, 1974,  
Chapter 122.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR THE DESIGNATION:

"The Registry Office at 70 Nicholas Street is recom-  
mended for designation as being of architectural and historical  
value. Erected in 1874, according to a general government plan,  
the building is an excellent example of a special social need  
resulting in a specific type of building. The round-headed  
window and door arches with rusticated quoins, the salmon-gold  
brick and barrel-vault ceiling establish a sense of officialdom  
in this miniature structure, giving the building an endearing  
and pleasant quality."
