#### REPORT RECOMMENDATION

That the Standing Committee on Environmental Protection, Water and Waste Management recommend Council direct staff to consult with the public and bring forward a report in Q2 2023 to amend the Tree Protection By-law, 2020-340 to

reduce the size of a Distinctive Tree in the suburban area of Ottawa from 50 centimeters to 30 centimeters in diameter measured at breast height.

#### RECOMMANDATION DU RAPPORT

Que le Comité permanent de la protection de l'environnement, de l'eau et de la gestion des déchets recommande au Conseil municipal d'inviter le personnel à consulter le public et à déposer, au deuxième trimestre de 2023, un rapport afin de modifier le *Règlement sur la protection des arbres nº 2020-340* pour réduire de 50 à 30 centimètres le diamètre à hauteur d'homme des arbres distinctifs dans la région suburbaine d'Ottawa.

### **BACKGROUND**

At the 17 May 2022 meeting of the Standing Committee on Environmental Protection, Water and Waste Management (SCEPWWM), Councillor Menard introduced the following Motion for the Committee's consideration at its next regular meeting:

# MOTION NO SCEPWWM 2022 24-02

Moved by Councillor S. Menard:

WHEREAS the City's Urban Forest Management Plan (<u>ACS2017-PIE-EDP-0012</u>), approved by Council on June 28, 2017, was established to provide a structured approach to protecting and enhancing the environmental, social, and economical services provided by the urban forest and to ensure that it is healthy and robust into the future; and

WHEREAS the City's Urban Forest Management Plan included a recommendation for staff to undertake a Tree By-law Review; and

WHEREAS Council approved a new Tree Protection By-law on January 29, 2020 (ACS2019-PIE-EDP-0052), to support the protection and enhancement of the City's urban tree canopy; and

WHEREAS a motion was passed by Council on June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2020 (<u>ACS2020-OCC-ENV-003</u>), to amend the Tree Protection By-law to reduce the diameter of a Distinctive Tree within the inner urban are from 50 cm to 30 cm in diameter at breast height and a report was subsequently approved by Council to make that amendment on November 24, 2020 (<u>ASC2020-PIE-EDP-0039</u>); and

WHEREAS in the suburban area of Ottawa, the distinctive tree diameter is currently set at 50 cm in diameter at breast height in the Tree Protection By-law; and

WHEREAS the value of the tree canopy in the suburban area should be reflected equally within the provisions of the Tree Protection By-law; and

WHEREAS there is value in streamlining the provisions for Distinctive Trees within the Tree Protection By-law to reduce resident confusion and to encourage compliance with the by-law.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Standing Committee on Environmental Protection, Water and Waste Management recommend Council direct staff to consult with the public and bring forward a report in Q2 2023 to amend the Tree Protection By-law, 2020-340 to reduce the size of a Distinctive Tree in the suburban area of Ottawa from 50 centimeters to 30 centimeters in diameter measured at breast height.
