REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Standing Committee on Environmental Protection, Water and Waste Management recommend Council:

- 1. Formally endorse the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty; and
- 2. Approve that the Mayor, on behalf of Council and the City of Ottawa, send a letter to the Prime Minister of Canada and the Premier of Ontario urging the

Canadian and Ontario governments to support the global initiative for a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty.

RECOMMANDATIONS DU RAPPORT

BACKGROUND

At the 17 May 2022 meeting of the Standing Committee on Environmental Protection, Water and Waste Management (SCEPWWM), Councillor McKenney introduced the following Motion for the Committee's consideration at its next regular meeting:

MOTION NO SCEPWWM 2022 24-01

Moved by Councillor C. McKenney:

WHEREAS the scientific consensus is clear that human activities, including fossil Staff will take direction from Council as appropriate.

fuel extraction and production, are primarily responsible for accelerating global climate change; and

WHEREAS the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change reported in 2022 that we must halve our greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 in order to have a reasonable chance of limiting global warming to 1.5°C; and

WHEREAS global governments and the fossil fuel industry are currently planning to produce about 110% more emissions by 2030 than what is needed to limit warming to 1.5°C and avert catastrophic climate disruption, and such plans risk undoing the work of our city to reduce GHG emissions through Energy Evolution;

and

WHEREAS changes in the City of Ottawa's climate are already being felt through hotter summers and increased frequency of major flooding events; and

WHEREAS the City of Ottawa declared a Climate Emergency on April 24, 2019 with the purpose of naming, framing, and deepening our commitment to protecting our economy, our ecosystems, and our community from climate change; and

WHEREAS the construction of new fossil fuel infrastructure and expanded reliance on fossil fuels exposes communities to untenable risks to public health and safety at the local and global levels and the time is now to phase-out fossil fuels and build a globally just transition for every worker, community and country; and

WHEREAS a new global initiative is underway calling for a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty that would end new fossil fuel exploration and expansion, phase out existing production in line with the global commitment to limit warming to 1.5°C, and accelerate equitable transition plans, which complements the objective of the Paris Agreement; and

WHEREAS endorsing the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty reaffirms the City's commitment to Energy Evolution; and

WHEREAS over 50 cities and local governments globally, including Toronto, Vancouver, and Montreal, have formally endorsed the treaty.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Standing Committee on Environmental Protection, Water and Waste Management recommend that Ottawa City Council formally endorse the Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Mayor, on behalf of Council and the City of Ottawa, send a letter from the Mayor to the Prime Minister of Canada and the Premier of Ontario urging the Canadian and Ontario governments to support the global initiative for a Fossil Fuel Non-Proliferation Treaty.
