He asked serious questions and provided excellent counsel that was critical to my son resolving his paranoia and stabilizing him. Since meeting with Cst. Poulton, my son has been much calmer and is steadily improving. I want to thank you for taking my son's call, for taking him seriously, and for resolving his fears. Your careful management of his call has helped him, and us, enormously.
