BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cost to undertake the levy vote be assessed to the constituency services budget of the College Ward Councillor's Office.

Councillor Moffatt further noted that a meeting is scheduled this week with the community to discuss this further and move forward on the next steps.

The Committee heard from the following delegations:

Joan Clark, Kilmorie Heritage Society spoke of the significance of this property and how it affects more than the community. She outlined the programs and services provided at this property.

George Neville noted his concern on the value of the property and how it has increased significantly over the course of the years.

Peter Ludwig concurred with comments from previous speakers. He asked Committee to consider the principle of fairness when voting on this item.

Discussion related to the cost of the property, costs for maintenance and operations and who the eligible voters are on this levy. After discussion, the Committee voted on the following motion:
