REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Built Heritage Sub-Committee recommend that Council:

- 1. Approve the application to alter the building at 66 Stewart Street according to plans by SAI Consultants, dated December 18, 2020 and attached as Documents 4 and 5, conditional upon:
 - The proposed new window and opening on the east façade original structure matching the style and profile of the other windows and openings on the historic building;
- 2. Delegate authority for minor design changes to the General Manager, Planning, Infrastructure and Economic Development;
- 3. Issue the heritage permit with a two-year expiry date from the date of issuance.

Jack Mallon, Junior Heritage Planner, Heritage Planning Branch, presented an overview of the report recommendations and answered questions from the Committee. Mr. Mallon noted that there was an error in the report on page 3, and that the property was surrounded by the Sandy Hill West Heritage Conservation District, not the Stewart Wilbrod Heritage Conservation District.
