BACKGROUND

The Community and Protective Services Committee, at its meeting of 20 May 2021, approved the following motion from Councillor Diane Deans, added to the agenda pursuant to 89(3) of the Procedure By-law (being By-law no. 2019-8).

“ THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Community and Protective Services Committee recommend that City Council direct the General Manager of Emergency and Protective Services under the umbrella of the Community, Safety and Well-Being (CSWB) Plan to, as soon as possible, take the lead to develop a Community Mental Health Strategy, working with the Ottawa Police Services, Ottawa Public Health, relevant City partners, health care and hospital partners and community stakeholders, including Ottawa Community Housing, to ensure that the efforts that are being undertaken already are co-ordinated and not duplicated, and report back with a draft strategy and any related funding in advance of the Draft 2022 Budget.”
