BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to present the Board of Health with the 2018 operating results for Public Health Programs. Ottawa Public Health (OPH) management actively monitors spending and revenue results for any underlying issues needing to be highlighted or addressed.

The 2018 operating budget year-end results present actual year-end revenues and expenditures against the amounts previously budgeted for the year.

DISCUSSION

As indicated in the <u>2018 Operating Budget Q2 Status Report</u>, OPH was projecting a balanced financial position for the 2018 fiscal year. OPH ended the year on budget while addressing emerging community health pressures such as cannabis implementation, the tornado response, infection prevention and control lapses (IPAC) and various other events. Savings from strategic position management enabled OPH to offset unexpected one-time costs, resulting in a balanced budget.

Supporting Document 1 provides operating budget details on year-end results for the various Ontario Public Health Standards. Financial information is presented by programs, which includes cost shared (75% provincial and 25% municipal), City-funded (100% municipal) and provincially-funded (100% provincial). Below, Table 1 provides a summary of the 2018 year-end results.

Operating Budget Adjustments and Transfers

Capital Project Update

On April 30, 2018, the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (MOHLTC) announced a \$672,100 one-time capital grant to support the planning/establishment or renovation of a supervised consumption service facility at 179 Clarence Street. Planning for the approved work began, however it was later halted after the MOHLTC announced a review of Ontario's Supervised Consumption Services and Overdose Prevention Sites.

On March 29, 2019, the MOHLTC announced that OPH was not one of the 15 approved Consumption and Treatment Services in Ontario. Adjustments required as a result of this announcement will be implemented and reported in the Q2 Operating and Capital Budget status report.
