### **COVID 19 RESPONSE**



- Ottawa Public Health is the lead agency for City of Ottawa response to Pandemic. This is coordinated through Office of Emergency Management.
- Our response is part of OPS
   Pandemic Plan and OPS Emergency
   Management Plan.
- Daily meetings with City, Provincial Policing partners, OPA / SOA and PSB.
- Regular meetings with NCR public safety partners, national and international policing agencies.













### **OPERATIONAL APPROACH**



- To deliver policing operations;
- Protect our members;
- Maintain our capacity to deliver police operations; and
- Protect our community and healthcare systems.



#### **CURRENT STATE- INTERNAL**



- Occupational Health and Safety Infection Control Practices
- Provides guidance on protection of OPS members and maintaining a healthy workforce.
- Pandemic Planning Team led.



### **CURRENT STATE- INTERNAL**




- Administrative Controls: Staffing Strategies (Work from home, staggered start times, virtual meetings / parades, reserve staffing model)
- Engineering Controls: Physical Barriers
- Personal Protective Equipment, Cleaning and Decontamination

- Created centralized internal web page to keep members updated.
  - Safety tips for frontline
  - Enforcement updates
  - Tips for working from home
  - Key contacts
  - Wellness / Mental Health
  - IT solutions
- Accessible via laptop, desktop or cellphone.



### **CURRENT STATE - EXTERNAL**




- Reached out to shuttered businesses to enhance safety with crime prevention tools.
- City-wide proactive patrols
- Outreach: NRT with food to vulnerable residents
- Education vs Enforcement: By-Law led (Emergency Measures and Civil Protection Act)
- Federal Quarantine Act- Compliance
- Anti-abuse campaign for women and children
- Frontline visits to Ottawa-area hospitals for show of solidarity and thanks.
  - Video created and sent to each hospital





## POLICING IMPACT- CALLS FOR SERVICE






- Year-to-date dispatched calls requiring on-scene police presence have fallen 3% or 3,000 calls
- Since March 16, dispatched calls declined by 30% (±200 calls/day)
  - § INCREASE:
    - Request Police Officer,
      Disputes (Partner, Neighbour,
      Family), Domestic
      Complaints, Mental Health,
      and Vagrancy
  - S Includes city-wide proactive patrols, help to businesses, community outreach.

### POLICING IMPACTS - CRIME TRENDS



- **Year-to-date** reported crime has fallen by 2%, due to fewer property crimes (Theft Under \$5,000)
- Shootings declined 55% to 9 incidents (-11) with 37 guns taken off the street (25 handguns)
- **Post state of emergency** reported crime has dropped by 20%
  - Fewer: Assaults (-7%), sexual violations (-30%), robberies (-43%), thefts (-50%)
  - Increase: Break and enter (60%),
     fraud (4%), mischief (6%)



### FINANCIAL UPDATE



- COVID 19 Pandemic response represents a major financial risk for the 2020 OPS Budget
- OPS Command team will provide monthly updates to the Board through FAC
- Significant financial controls already implemented
- Current forecast ranges from a deficit between \$1.4M
   and \$5.9M
- Additional options are under review to reduce in year deficit and manage longer term impacts
