Primary concerns, by individual

Marianne Wilkinson, People's Warden, St. John's Anglican Church, Kanata North (written submission)

- concern about the removal of the 7.5 metre heritage setback and reduction of the rear yards that back onto the cemetery to 5 metres (but decided not to formally object)
- concern about the drainage being carried in a perforated pipe through the 5metre deep rear yards which will be completely decked, so that the drainage will be under many decks, which will be hard to maintain
- concern about landscaping, and, since no trees can be installed on the decks, they are working with Minto to have landscaping added on the church property, including along the edge of the cemetery, as a screen for those using the cemetery and to provide some greenery for our future new neighbours
- skeptical that parking will not be a problem because the entry road is narrow, which limits the ability to have parking along it, and Sandhill does have space for street parking but with the Kanata Mosque now on the north side of the property, the church on the south and a public school to the east, parking during special events at those locations will reduce availability for residents in this development; the town houses along the Sandhill frontage will take away any street parking there reducing what is presently available
