BACKGROUND

The purpose of this report is to present to the Board the first quarter operating results for Public Health Programs. Ottawa Public Health (OPH) management actively reviews their quarterly results to ensure that their respective spending and revenue results are not indicative of any underlying issues needing to be highlighted or addressed.

The 2017 operating budget first quarter results present actual year-to-date revenues and expenditures against the amounts budgeted for the corresponding period.

DISCUSSION

Document 1 provides operating budget details on first quarter results for the various Ontario Public Health Standards. Financial information is presented by funding type, which includes cost-shared (75% province and 25% city); city funded (100% municipal); and provincial or federal funded (100% provincial or federal) along with a breakdown by specific program.

Document 2 provides compensation information showing the actual salary, benefits and overtime costs incurred by OPH during the corresponding period.

Q2 Operating Results

Based on the results to March 31, 2017, OPH is projecting a balanced financial position for the current fiscal year.

Table 1 outlines the annual expenditures and revenues by funding source, the year-todate budget status.

Q1 Compensation Results

Document 2 shows the operating status for OPH compensation expenditures up to March 31, 2017. The current financial information shows OPH has spent 25% of its total compensation budget during the first quarter of 2017 operations and 27% of its overtime budget. This is reflective of enhanced response related to Opioids. It should be noted that new and emerging compensation pressures have been identified for 2017 related to the opioid crisis, major legislative reform and IPAC (infection prevention and control), however these costs are expected to be offset by one-time provincial funding and operating surplus in other areas.

Provincial Funding Update

The 2017 budget was developed assuming a 2.5% increase (\$765K) to the provincial funding allotment for cost shared programs, 0% increase for provincial 100% funded programs, and a \$375K increase, as directed by the City, for funding of cost shared programs. The 2017 budget report also indicated that OPH would apply for one-time funding through the MOHLTC and other sources for various projects, as well as seek additional one-time funding opportunities for 2017.

On Friday, April 21, 2017, OPH received a letter from the MOHLTC advising that the Ministry would be providing the Ottawa Board of Health with \$89,500 in additional one-

time funding for the 2015-2016 funding year and up to \$304,600 in additional one-time funding for the 2016-2017 funding year to support the provision of mandatory and related public health programs in services in our community.

OPH also received confirmation of \$102,000 in OAP funding for the implementation of the "Dental Care for low-income older adults" project in 2017.

Operating Budget Adjustments and Transfers

Given these recent funding announcements, adjustments will be made to the 2017 budget in Q2.

The MOHLTC has implemented changes for the 2017/2018 Community Infrastructure Renewal Fund. This renewal fund provides a new opportunity for OPH to address repair and renewal needs related to client & staff safety, security, privacy, *Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act* and infection prevention and control at two facilities: Healthy Sexuality Clinic (179 Clarence Street) and the Immunization Clinic (100 Constellation Crescent). The request totals \$1.02 Million.
