BACKGROUND

In 2011, the Ottawa Police Service (OPS) assumed responsibility from the Ottawa Police Services Board relating to rewards issued to the public for information leading to the arrest and prosecution of persons responsible for identified unsolved homicides and other major investigations.

A policy was put in place which outlined the guidelines associated with reward monies and the terms and conditions for payment.

DISCUSSION

In June 2015, a single reward poster* was issued by Major Crime in relation to the ongoing and unsolved murder of Yusuf Ibrahim. This murder has since been solved but not as a result of the reward poster.

*(Rewards were offered by Crime Stoppers in 2015, but that falls outside of this Policy). To date, no monies have been paid out under this Policy and as such there is no financial implication.
