REPORT RECOMMENDATIONS:

That the Standing Committee on Environmental Protection, Water and Waste Management recommend that Council:

- 1. Receive the City's 2019-2022 Energy Conservation and Demand Management Plan as attached in Document 1; and**
- 2. Approve an average 8-year payback for energy reduction investments, to allow for an expansion of the energy reduction program and more comprehensive building upgrades.**

At the outset, Mr. Dan Chénier, General Manager, Recreation, Cultural and Facilities Services (RCFS) Department, introduced Mr. Blake Strachan, Project Manager, Building Engineering and Energy Management Branch, RCFS. Mr. Chénier then spoke to a detailed slide presentation overview of the report, a copy of which is held on file with the City Clerk.

Committee discussions and questions to staff touched upon: the conservation of energy through better resource management (i.e., water for splash pads); greater efficiencies, energy cost savings and greenhouse gas reductions that may be achieved through system automation; building retrofits and aging infrastructure; discussions about tying into the Federal Government's District Energy System;
