There had been no sign of activity in the heavily tinted vehicle and I hesitated to call but eventually I decided to place my trust in the Ottawa Police Service to investigate and handle the situation with discretion. I was not to be disappointed. Two cruisers arrived within five minutes of my call. After a few minutes of, presumably assessing the situation and checking the license plate, two officers got out of their respective vehicles. They had a look in the vehicle with the aid of a flashlight and then tapped lightly on one of the windows. They waited patiently for several minutes before a young person emerged, still half-asleep, from the back seat of the vehicle. I could not have been more proud of the professional, and non-confrontational way in which the two officers handled this situation. They politely asked the young man, dazed, and likely nervous, for his registration and driver's license. After verifying all of that, they appeared to suggest to the young man that he should pick up his discarded coffee cups beside the vehicle. I suspect they also gently suggested that this was not an optimum place to sleep the night. Who knows what that young man's situation at home is. Just like that, the young man and the police cruisers left the scene. No doubt, this was simply another routine call for the officers involved, and they have likely not given the incident a second thought. However, as a concerned citizen watching from the absolute

safety of my bedroom window, it was an exemplary display of professionalism and sound judgement by two of Ottawa's finest. BRAVO!
