Excerpt from letter: Our charitable non-profit agency supports persons with developmental disabilities. During the last week of May, our staff filed a missing persons report and we were contacted by Constable Stephen Bond indicating that he had located the missing individual. The officer showed great compassion and

understanding for a guarded and suspicious individual, and was fantastic as well with our staff. He stayed throughout the lengthy process of persuading the person to accept our help. Officer Bond was instrumental in ensuring this person's long-term success by driving the individual to our emergency building. In the past, officers merely handed the person off to us and went on to other more pressing business. Officer Bond understood that investing a few hours now would yield greater results and save time and resources later. OCAPDD is very appreciative of his level-headed practical approach; he deserves a commendation for his handling of a person with developmental disabilities who also presented with mental health issues.

Excerpt from letter: The SRO program has great value for us within the Ottawa area. From the school's perspective, it allows for a proactive relationship to develop between educators and law enforcement with the primary goal being the maintenance of a safe, positive school climate. Timely and effective sharing of appropriate information often deescalates issues before they become crises and allows the school ready access to subject matter expertise on a number of emergency-response issues. Having someone who knows our school and our needs to call at these times has been very reassuring. From the community's perspective, the program promotes a youth-centric form of police

service focused on prevention, diversion and education, rather than prosecution and enforcement. It allows specific officers a window into the lives of youth-at-risk, and an opportunity to provide services and support across multiple organizations. The SROs understand the community and the school culture and deal with issues proactively so they don't escalate either at school or in the community. We encounter issues within the community that go beyond the expertise of school administrators and we rely on our SROs for very specialized support. They are proactive in helping parents and schools work through many different situations. The SROs are also very helpful with lockdowns and other safety measures within the school community. In addition, SROs are the personal face of the police services in maintaining a positive relationship with young children. This supports our children by letting them know that the police are people to help them in a time of need. The close relationships we have with these officers allows us to ask advice, ask questions, and have our questions answered. Thank you for this service.
