## BACKGROUND

At its meeting of 12 September 2012, City Council approved a new structure for its <a href="Advisory Committees">Advisory Committees</a> to ensure that the work of these committees align with the Term of Council Priorities.

In order to determine the advisory committees' work plans for the current Term, departmental staff provided information with respect to the applicable Term of Council Priorities, approved by Council on December 11, 2019, and departmental work plan(s) and identified areas in which the Advisory Committees could best provide support and advice.

The Office of the City Clerk worked with department staff to standardize work plan documents across Advisory Committees. This implemented the standard set by Council as part of the <u>2014-2018 Mid-Term Governance Review report</u>, at its meeting of 9 November 2016.

The mandate of the Arts, Culture and Recreation Advisory Committee is to advise Ottawa City Council on policy, programs and service delivery in the area of arts, recreation and culture. The complete Terms of Reference can be found at Document 2 of this report.

The Advisory Committee discussed the development of its proposed work plan at its meeting of 22 September 2020, for submission to Standing Committee and Council.

## **DISCUSSION**

At the September 22, 2020 meeting of the Arts, Culture and Recreation Advisory Committee (ACRAC), considered and approved, in principle, its draft 2020-2022 Work Plan, which was finalized off-line and approved by the Chair in time to meet the deadline for inclusion on the Community and Protective Services Committee (CPSC) agenda of Thursday, November 19, 2020. It is now before the CPSC for its approval

and recommendation for approval by City Council at its meeting of Wednesday, December 9, 2020.

The proposed work plan aligns with the 2019-2022 Term of Council Priorities that also fall within the Advisory Committee's Terms of Reference. Should Council approve the work plan, the Advisory Committee will consider information received from staff pertaining to each objective / activity within the work plan's timelines, and have opportunity to provide feedback or recommendations on information presented as part of a working group / stakeholder group consultation process with staff, with the status or outcome of each goal to be annotated in the workplan and reported annually.
