**Excerpt from Letter:** I wish to express my deep gratitude for the work that all of you do every day to protect civil society, in an often thankless job where day-to-day successes are rarely celebrated. Officer Menendez has restored my faith in the police. He was so nice and his frontline service was impeccable. I thanked him and told him to keep up the good work and to stay safe.

Excerpt from Letter: We had an incident in our community with a 16-year-old male I found in distress. After talking with him for a good 15 minutes I decided to call an ambulance. First I was impressed with the efficiency of the call centre. They reminded me and the other people waiting with me that the ambulance and police needed the 6-feet pandemic distancing to do their work. Upon arriving I was very impressed how courteous they were; all wore their mask and the paramedics gowns. The thing that surprised me the most was how they showed concern and kindness for this young man. You see recently I have been watching the news and the riots around the world. I've seen the violence of the police in the United States and it has scared me and made me feel vulnerable. Last night gave me hope for the future. I am grateful to live here and feel the safety of our police. Thank you for that. Thank you for often putting your life on the line for us all. Your efforts and your professionalism are extremely appreciated. Keep up the good work.

Excerpt from Letter: We had a break-in at our house; it was a disconcerting experience as we were home at the time, with my fiancée asleep. We called police and Constables Anh Dieu and Stephane Ethier were assigned. Cst. Dieu has already identified the person and laid charges, and his professional attitude and support in the last weeks has been exemplary and very much appreciated. Cst. Ethier, who arrived at our house minutes after we reported the break-in was consistently calm, friendly, understanding and supportive. Within 15 short minutes of his arrival my fiancée had gone from being terrified (as she was asleep at the time) to joking with the officer about locking our doors when he left. His attitude and compassion were beyond our expectations and was exactly what was necessary at the time to get everyone calm and feel safe. Absolutely an extremely positive experience with Ottawa Police only minutes after a scary situation. Bravo to both officers and our sincere appreciation to the Ottawa Police Service.
