Re: New Beer Framework

On behalf of member Medical Officers of Health, Boards of Health, and Affiliate organizations of the Association of Local Public Health Agencies (alPHa), I am writing today with respect to the recently announced decision to make beer available in Ontario supermarkets.

Consistent with our correspondence with you on this matter in the weeks leading up to the announcement, we are disappointed that this initiative is going forward. The preventable burden of chronic diseases resulting from increased access to beverage alcohol remains a concern for us.

That said, we are pleased to see that due consideration has been given to social responsibility by placing clear limits on this reform. The application of existing rules for alcohol retailing such as restricting hours of sale, ensuring minimum pricing, ensuring training of checkout staff and clearly separating shelf space within the stores are all important efforts in mitigating the risks.

As we move forward, we will continue to carry out our duties under the *Ontario Public Health Standards* to evaluate the impacts of alcohol consumption and to influence the development and implementation of healthy public policies pertaining to alcohol.

As our colleagues at CAMH have said, "an approach to alcohol policy that prioritizes public health and considers the costs associated with alcohol consumption is critical to our health and well-being." As your government implements the recommendations of the Premier's Council on Government Assets, we encourage you to keep health considerations at the forefront.
