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### BACKGROUND



- Board approved full cost recovery approach for Background Check fees in 2017
  - Included in 2017 and 2018 budgets to achieve \$2M efficiency targets
  - Average cost \$65
- Significant public consultation occurred in 2018
- PSB approved the current fee structure October 2018
  - Rates went into effect January 1st, 2019
  - Resolved \$2.4M budget deficit
- Board directed OPS to look at revised pricing structure for notfor-profits
  - Board reduced background check revenue budget by \$400K at February 25th meeting.

# **BACKGROUND CONT'D**



- Staff were also asked to survey other police services in Ontario and report back on the following:
  - Fee structures
  - Costing methodologies
- Board passed the following motion in February 2019:
  - "Be it resolved that Staff report back to the Board in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2019 with options for adjustments to the fees for background checks, taking into account the need to fairly distribute the cost of the service amongst users."
- FAC received presentation from staff on May 14 2019

# **OPS BACKGROUND CHECKS**



- Significant growth in volume
  - Doubled since 2013 to 90,000 in 2018
- 70% of police records checks at OPS are related to not-for-profits
- Before launch of on-line system
  - Paper based, manual process with multiple touchpoints and duplicate data entry
  - 13 week backlog
- Launch of on-line system
  - Faster processing times (13 weeks to 48 hrs)
  - Reduced staffing pressures (from 17 FTE's to 11 FTE's)
- OPS is the first on-line service in Canada that offers full electronic end-to-end processing within 24-48 hours

#### **COST RECOVERY MODEL – OTHER ONTARIO POLICE SERVICES**

Variety of cost recovery models

Level of detail and methodology varies significantly amongst police services

- Main pricing models in use:
  - Direct cost recovery
  - Direct costs plus a mark-up to cover indirect costs
  - A few set fees based on what other police services are charging

### **PRINCIPLES FOR FEE OPTIONS**

- 1. Treat all categories equitably
- 2. Maintain efficient administrative process
  - 1. Avoid multi tier pricing models
  - 2. Avoid manual validation processes
- 3. Minimize cross segment subsidization

### **FEE STRUCTURE OPTIONS**

#### Option A:

- § Status quo
  - S Employment fees at \$90, Volunteer fees at \$0
- Option B:
  - S Partial cost recovery Volunteers pay \$0
    - § \$400K revenue provision applied to reduce cost for Employment
    - S Employment fees reduced to \$75

Option C:

- S Partial cost recovery Volunteers pay \$20
  - S Employment fees reduced to \$65 (Avg cost)
  - S Volunteer fees phased in at \$10 for remainder of 2019, increasing to \$20 on January 1 2020

# **FEE STRUCTURE OPTIONS**

Options	Employment Fee	Volunteer Fee	Annualized Budget Impact
Option A – Status Quo	\$90	\$0	\$0.4M
Option B – Partial Cost Recovery	\$75	\$0	-
Option C* – Partial Cost Recovery	\$65	\$20	-

\* Volunteer fee phased in at \$10 in 2019, increasing to \$20 on January 1 2020

# RECOMMENDATION

#### **Option C**

Employment fees are reduced to \$65 average cost

Volunteer fee introduced at \$10 in 2019, increasing to \$20 in 2020, which is the average fee charged by other police services across Ontario

#### Analysis

- Achieves \$400K revenue reduction per Board budget motion
- Minimizes customer subsidization (no customer paying more than average cost)
- Phases in Volunteer fee
- Maintains efficiency of administrative processing
