BACKGROUND

Attendance

Attached at Document 1 is information about the Canadian Association of Police Governance (CAPG) 30th Annual Conference being held in Calgary, Alberta from August 9 - 11, 2019. All members of the Police Services Board received the conference information and were canvassed regarding their interest in attending. Chair D. Deans, Vice Chair L.A. Smallwood, Member D. Nirman, and Executive Director K. Ferraro have advised they wish to attend. Vice Chair Smallwood has a vested interest in attending: he is a member of the CAPG Board of Directors.

The Ottawa Police Services Board recognizes the importance of ongoing professional development and education for its members through its policies and in particular through the training policy adopted in 2006 in response to a recommendation from the City's Auditor General. The Board also ensures that sufficient funds are included in its budget each year to support its commitment to ongoing education and to enable Board members to attend various learning opportunities throughout the year.

Sponsorship

Attached at Document 2 is a letter from CAPG Executive Director Jennifer Malloy, inviting boards to support the 2019 Conference with a financial contribution.

CONSULTATION

Not applicable.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The approximate cost of attending the conference is \$2,500 per person. Funds have been allocated for this expense in the 2019 Employee Development and Travel account. There are sufficient funds remaining in the Board's budget to cover this expenditure.

Funds for grants in the amount of \$115,500 were included in the Board's approved 2019 budget; \$50,000 was pre-committed to the Boys and Girls Club of Ottawa and \$10,000 was earmarked for the Street Ambassador Program. The Board also uses this fund to assist in sponsoring a number of Board-related conferences, namely the Ontario Association of Police Services Boards and the Canadian Association of Police Governance. Based on projected requests for discretionary funding in 2019, there are sufficient funds to cover this expenditure.
