 neighbouring property owner, raised concerns about impacts the development would have in terms of its setbacks and windows, particularly with respect to sun-shadowing, loss of privacy, reduced air circulation, and congested parking

Primary reasons for support, by individual

Murray Chown, Novatech (applicant) (oral submission)

- spoke to improved design features of this proposal versus the one from 2008, noting
 that this proposal is set back more than the required minimum distance, that the sky
 views on all east side units would be blocked whether the new development is 4
 storeys or 6, and that the building will be treated with a better finish to reflect light into
 windows of properties facing west
- the ward councillor and Centretown Community Association are generally supportive of the application
