Binitha Sutarwala, Chinmaya Mission Ottawa (written submission)

- the staff report does not indicate that the adjacent property, the community center that is also a place of worship, will be impacted by this change
- the staff report does not indicate what necessary mitigation measures will need to be imposed on this developer as a result of the additional traffic, the location of the proposed private access road off Ogilvie Road drainage, noise and so much more
- the process does not seem fair and balanced for the actual neighbors of this
 development; was disappointed to read that the City dismissed a community group
 of over 400 members as a "low number of public comments received"; questioned
 whether the group needs to sign a petition indicating its concerns in order to be
 better represented
- based on section 37, the developer is improving Ken Steele Park, but it is not clear
 what the developer or the City will do to compensate for the significant changes the
 community group will have to endure during the construction and final stages; there
 are no formal mitigation requirements for the community center stipulated in this
 document as part of the planning process
- the Private access road off Ogilvie Road that will be introduced as part of this
 design will immediately affect their property since there are no buffer strips being
 introduced to mitigate the noise, traffic, safety to their members, drainage,
 vandalism

- there is no introduction of mitigative measures from the traffic lights shining into the place of worship
- tall and raised structures will severely affect the enjoyment of their property on a daily basis due the shadows they will cast over the entire building footprint
