EXTRACT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SUB-COMMITTEE MINUTES 2 THURSDAY, 25 JUNE 2015

Chair Chiarelli and Vice-Chair Leiper briefly spoke to introduce this item, an initiative to direct that the City help in the design and production of a real-time smartphone (i.e., iPhone, Android or other platform-compatible) application (app) to help users locate the nearest public restrooms in the City of Ottawa.

Ms. Sarah Good, Carleton University, was also recognized for her initial work on this initiative. The Committee then heard from the following delegations, both of which were in support of the report recommendations:

- Ms. Joan Kuyek, "Gotta Go!" Campaign
- Ms. Bessa Whitmore and the "Raging Grannies"

Councillor Wilkinson pointed out a conflict in the report recommendations, with the first direction asking the City to produce an app, and with the subsequent three directions encouraging the private sector to do so. She suggested it might be better to rephrase the first recommendation to direct Staff to *ensure that an app is produced*. Councillor Leiper agreed to Councillor Wilkinson's friendly amendment.
