Dear Councillor El-Chantiry;

Thank you for the opportunity to provide the Ottawa Police Services Board with our Semi-Annual Report. We look forward to providing you with an informative update on our progress and outline initiatives being worked on.

Our report will outline the following:

Board Governance

We continue to benefit from a committed and talented group of volunteer directors. Our board composition represents a broad spectrum of experienced individuals that contribute to the success of Crime Stoppers. Two new board members were recently elected to the board and bring creativity and energy to our team. Mr. Stephen Merils and Mr. Eric Surprenant have been valuable additions.

2015 marks Crime Stoppers 30th anniversary in the National Capital Region. This ingenious crime solving and prevention program has contributed much to the safety and security of our communities. We are planning celebratory events throughout the year to acknowledge this milestone.

Eastern Ontario Crime Stoppers programs will be meeting on April 26, 2015 to share best practices and discuss opportunities for greater partnership. Smiths Falls and District Crime Stoppers will be hosting this event.

Statistics

Our 2014 year to date statistics have been attached for your review. We are pleased to report that the tip volume and tip quality continues to increase. We received 4069 tips in 2014, resulting in a 17% increase from 2013. There was also a significant increase in the number of criminal charges with 33 in 2013 and 150 in 2014. Arrests; criminal cases cleared; recovered property and recovered firearms all increased in 2014.

Community Outreach

We were delighted to participate with the official launch of the Vanier community crime prevention program in November 2014. This community initiative was launched with participation from the local business, police and government representatives. Crime Stoppers information was included on their creative signage and awareness campaign.

Crime Stoppers volunteers participated in both the City of Ottawa Help Santa Toy parade as well as the Orleans Parade of Light and Sound. Once again, our youth volunteers and board members created a wonderful experience to connect with the community. Ottawa Police Service members also participated with both events and helped secure the Grinch.





Crime Stoppers have also participated in a wide variety of community events. Our jail cell was borrowed by Cystic Fibrosis Ottawa and helped them raise funds during a gala event. We were appreciative of their recognition and appreciation for our contribution.

January marked Crime Stoppers month in Canada and once again our team deployed to raise awareness throughout the region. We were very pleased to provide table top displays at all of the local shopping malls as well as our local post-secondary institutions. These opportunities to partner with the community are invaluable to our success.

Volunteers provided information during several community events, including an event hosted by Councilor Mark Taylor on February 3rd, 2015 and a winter community day in Britannia.





A key element to our outreach is engaging with youth in the community. We were delighted to have a creative bilingual hand out developed in collaboration with Ottawa Police Service Youth Advisory Committee (YAC).



Partner Update

Ottawa Police Service support is instrumental to our program. Sgt. Arthur Wong continues to provide outstanding leadership and support for Crime Stoppers. Assistant Coordinator, Mr. Jim Wiles will be missed as he retires in the coming weeks. Jim has served the Crime Stoppers program with much enthusiasm and we look forward to working with his successor. We continue to partner with our other law enforcement partners throughout our region and very much appreciate the support and assistance from all of our partners.

We certainly appreciate OPS quartermaster updating crime scene tape to include Crime Stoppers contact information. While we hope that this tape is not required, we understand that having our number posted at crime scenes may remind tipsters to contact us.

OC Transpo transit law have been especially helpful during Crime Stoppers month and we were pleased to provide a presentation to their community service and leadership team in February. Crime Stoppers decals are now displayed on their Special Constable fleet vehicles and we continue to work to develop this relationship.

We have been working with the National Coalition Against Contraband Tobacco and we are pleased to support this initiative. We will be participating in an upcoming marketing campaign to raise awareness around contraband tobacco.

Media Update

I am always pleased to represent Crime Stoppers during media appearances and any opportunity to share information about our program. On March 6th, 2015 Councilor Taylor, Acting Staff Sergeant Bryden and I participated during a Rogers TV 22 segment hosted by Mark Sutcliffe. I was also able to provide several radio interviews with CFRA, including an appearance on CFRA Homepage with Rick Gibbons.

Several local radio stations aired Crime Stoppers public service announcements during Crime Stoppers month. These announcements highlighted our volunteer appreciations, success and helped kick off our 30th anniversary awareness. Our vice-president, Mr. Jim Tugwell and local radio personality, Mr. Steve Gregory helped produce these informative pieces.

Metroland Media reporter Ms. Erin McCracken interviewed us for a very informative piece that appeared in their publications. She captured a great deal of information and was very thorough in her reporting.

Crime Stoppers offered our highest cash reward (\$2000.00) for information concerning several recent bank robberies. This media release resulted in extensive coverage and exposure for these crimes. This further demonstrates the important role that media can contribute to our success and community safety.

Social media continues to develop as a showcase for crimes in our community. Our website has also emerged as a destination for the public to connect with local crime events. With over 13000 individual page views, this venue offers many possibilities for continued success.
