The level of empathy and professionalism from him had a significant and lasting impact that he likely has no knowledge about. I wanted to thank him for his help during this difficult time.

Excerpt from Letter: I am a retired Chief Warrant Officer and a 35-year veteran of the Canadian Armed Forces. I suspected that I had Post Traumatic Stress Disorder but never had the courage to seek help. Constable J.F. Desjardins pulled me over and could smell alcohol on my breath. He had me do a roadside test three times, which I failed. Subsequently I was arrested for DUI. While in cells, I completely lost control and attempted suicide. They were going to bring me to the hospital but I asked if I could go to my friend's place instead. Cst. Desjardins discussed this with Sergeant Scott Kendall and they both agreed to my request. During the drive to my friend's house, Cst. Desjardins gave me some tough love. He explained to me what I needed to do prior to court (i.e. seek medical help, go to AA and Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC)). The following morning I acted on his recommendations. Cst. Desjardins' compassionate and professional approach to policing saved my life. His quick analysis of the situation not only saved me but, but also put me on the road to recovery. Excerpt from Letter: I would just like to convey my gratitude and deep appreciation for

the Victim Crisis Unit of the Ottawa Police Service. I live in Newfoundland and had called 911 for a wellness check on my mother in Ottawa. At 2 a.m. they called me back and told me they were so sorry for my loss. I was in complete shock and barely put myself on the plane to Ottawa. She was my only living family and I had loved her very much. As soon as I landed in Ottawa, a representative from Victim Crisis Unit contacted me, and helped me to just focus on the things I needed to do. As you can imagine, since I had no one in Ottawa, without the crucial services provided by the Victim Crisis Unit, I would have felt helpless to deal with this alone. Eva Savage from the VCU put me in touch with legal aid to understand my next-of-kin rights, helped me walk in to my mother's apartment for the first time, guided me on next steps, and was always there when I felt stuck with the bureaucratic process. I hope that this crucial unit continues to be a vital part of the police service. In these challenging times, it gives the Service such a humane face, and is a preventive measure - which will likely help many of us not fall victims ourselves to people who would try take advantage of us when we may not be at our best. Thank you to the OPS once again for taking care of me and my mom.
