Although my mind convinced me that they were there to capture me, both were able to assure me they were not. When I refused to speak to them, they found alternatives to get me out of the bathroom and surrender the delusion, and ultimately my weapon.

They made me understand that they were the good guys. The fact that I was armed in close quarters and they did not use any force whatsoever, was unbelievable. Their tactical communication and composure was astounding and literally saved my life. Once out of the bathroom the officers convinced me to go to hospital with them and did not even place me in handcuffs, knowing it would stress me. I was treated as a human being and not a criminal -- and I am forever grateful. At hospital, both officers were able to distract me from my precarious mental health situation by engaging me in conversation and finding us a private room to wait. This city and police services everywhere need more officers like both of you. You uphold the badge with honour, integrity and respect.
