Constable Latourell was first to arrive and quickly reassured me that he would look after the children until my husband or brother-in-law showed up, and jokingly volunteered to tidy up some dishes. He called my husband's work and explained the situation and waited until my brother-in-law showed up. I ended up having an emergency surgery and am now safely home and wanted to give a special shout-out to Constables Latourell and Abdi. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts!

Excerpt from letter: I am writing to commend the actions of one of your officers. The building next door to my home is a multi-unit rental. One of the tenants there seems to have very serious mental-health issues. He is loud and aggressive, and sometimes carries a weapon. The police are often here because of him – I've called for service myself on a number of occasions when things have been especially frightening. Late yesterday afternoon I heard loud angry shouting in front of my house and saw him in an altercation with a man walking by. Soon after multiple OPS cars arrived on the street in front of my house, talked with the man who'd called them and tried to talk with this tenant. Early last evening, when heading out to meet a friend, an OPS car with two officers pulled up and told me that they'd found the man out on the street behaving inappropriately. They said he is once again in custody, and likely to be there for a while. I really appreciate the entire interaction with the officers yesterday. They took the situation seriously – which must be hard because the system does not make it easy for

them to deal with this problem. They took the time to come back and give me the peace of mind of knowing that the risk associated with this man is deferred again for a period of time. I'd like to specifically thank Constable Kristopher Montgomery, along with his incar partner. They're exactly the kind of officers I want to have in my community and I'm pleased that they were the ones who responded to the call.

I have been in an abusive relationship and finally got up the courage to end things. My boyfriend (now exboyfriend) refused to leave my apartment, became violent and I had to flee, fearing for my safety. After a few hours of walking around outside, and not knowing what to do, I decided to call the Ottawa Police for help. The dispatch was very kind and understanding and assured me I had done the right thing by calling. The three officers arrived in a very timely manner. This was the first time I have ever called the police in my life and I was nervous – and embarrassed about the situation. These officers were extremely understanding, took the time to explain what they were going to do, and gave me options if he returned. They made me feel protected, good about my decision to call them for help, and assured me that I shouldn't hesitate to call if I felt I needed to in the future. Excerpt from letter: On April 8 of this year, I lost a dear friend who I found suddenly departed in his apartment. When the police arrived, Constable Nicole Miller was an angel in disguise. She was calm, supportive, considerate of the situation, and helped ease the whole bureaucratic process we found ourselves having to go through that day. Her boss, who also appeared on the scene for a brief time, was also extremely helpful and supportive. I know that the Ottawa Police are having some difficulties of late and morale is likely low; however, these two officers, in my mind, demonstrated what policing is really all about – community, caring, and support. I hope these officers may know of this compliment to their professionalism and humanitarianism.
